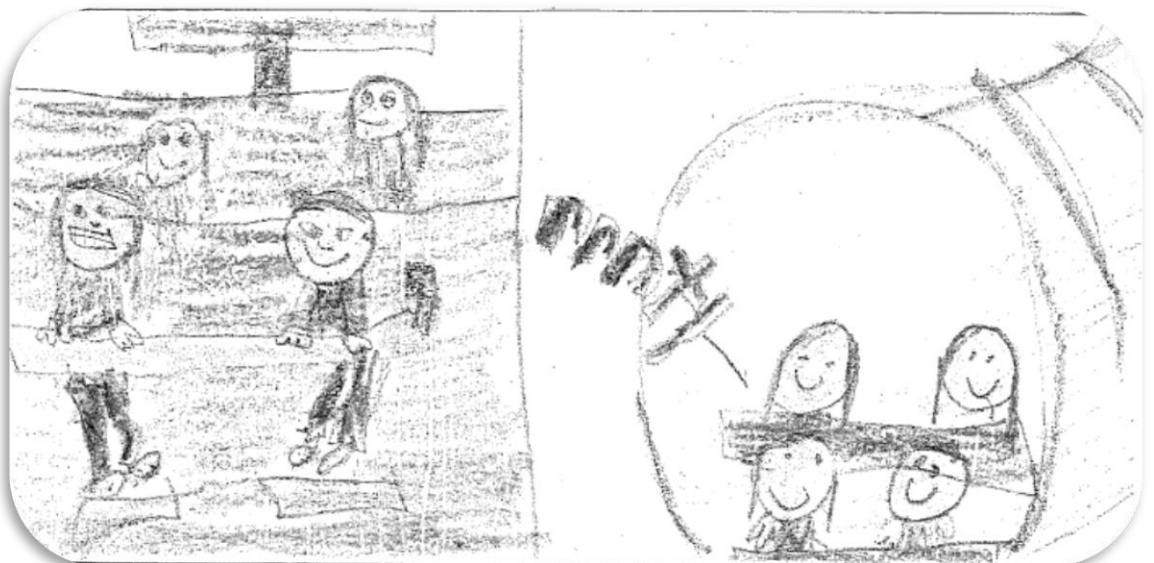
The sun was setting. "Momma," I said. "how many rides can we still go on?"
