Murphy Drop-Off and Pick-Up Refresher

Winter months are busy times in our parking lot. We have many more car riders at this time. The following is just a refresher that will help keep our students safe and our line

Drop-Off – Please...

- Pull as far forward in the loop as possible. Even though you may be going past the entrance, it helps fit several more cars in line so we're not backed up into the road.
- Stay in your car if you are going through the loop. If you would like to get out and help your child with bags/coats/etc., please park in the lot and walk them up.
- Have students get out the door closest to the curb.
- Parents parking in the lot, please wait for the crossing guard to stop traffic. We may hold you up for a few seconds to get more cars through the loop faster.

In the Loop Pick-Up – Please...

- Pull close to the car in front of you to fit more cars.
- If the loop is full and backed up to the entrance, pull around and continue the loop along the south end (along Pratt Rd) of the parking lot. Please be wary of people who are doing this and try not to cut in front of them.
- Stay in your car. Our staff will help students get into cars.

Walk Up Pick-Up

Many parents prefer to get out of cars and walk up to get their child. Please follow these procedures if you choose to do this.

- Park as far to the <u>west end</u> as possible. (See following for reason why)
- Please do not cross in front of the loop line. This not only slows the loop line way down, but it is very dangerous.
- Please be courteous to other drivers and let people in when appropriate.
- Please walk up to the grade level lines to get your child. Do not call them to you as many kids will run in front of cars without paying attention.

The unfortunate thing is, I have yet to see a school drop-off/pick-up procedure that doesn't have its flaws. We are just packing a small parking lot and loop with more cars than it was designed for. The fact is, when we follow these simple tips, we can make things more efficient, but it will never be perfect. We appreciate everyone's cooperation to make it work the best it can.

What's next?


February – The student council will host a fun filled spirit week. It will be the week of February 16th. They will be selecting the dress up days during a January meeting.
